Please find attached grades from the recent mock examinations, together with a grade representing your child's attitude to learning. Together with a Parents' Evening conversation we hope that these will provide all the information families need to make informed decisions about accepting offers, our advice would be to select an insurance offer which matches these mock results, and a realistic firm choice.

Please note that Health & Social Care grades are not included in this report following January examination results due to be issued on Friday 20th March, should you/your child only be enrolled onto a Health & Social Care course, the academic Section of your report will be blank.

Art and Design subjects - Due to the publication of this year's exam papers in January and February (GCSE release date 2.1.26 and A level release date 1.2.26), in all four Art and Design subjects; Fine Art, Photography, Textile Design and Graphic Communication, and the fact that our students are therefore already working on their respective exam papers, we are unable to comment on any related matter. The Art and Design teachers will therefore be unavailable for the year 11 and year 13 Parent's evenings and there will be no progress grades released for the forthcoming progress data reports. Thank you for your understanding.

Attitude to Learning

Please see below, there is an explanation of the attitude to learning grade shown on the summary report:

Exemplary: This grade describes a pupil who is working hard and is well-motivated. They complete the vast majority of classwork and homework to the best of their ability and invariably to a high standard. They have a positive attitude towards their studies, are well-focused and participate fully in lessons.

Good: This grade describes a pupil who is working well but they need to put in a little more effort at times so that they can achieve consistently in line with the school's expectations. They complete most of their classwork and homework to the best of their ability. However, with greater focus or participation in lessons, they could do even better.

Below Expected Standard: This grade highlights that there are some concerns with the progress they are making, and they are currently underachieving. They often do not give full effort when doing either classwork or homework. Overall, greater application and an improved attitude towards learning are required.

Cause for Concern: This grade reflects that there are significant concerns about this pupil. They need to improve their effort and attitude significantly. They need to make improvements in their effort towards classwork and homework. Their behaviour during lessons must also improve. They are often unfocused and may disrupt learning. At present, their poor attitude and effort are resulting in significant underachievement.
